Saturday morning Steve and I walked around the race track. A lovely venue






In the afternoon we all made our way across to the races. We all had a good laugh, some because they were winning (Alan) and others because they were losing.

Breakfast @ 10.00am followed by Membership renewal and




# **TECHIE STUFF:**

This section is written as a guide only - I'm no expert and I am willing to be corrected if any of the statements are wrong or misleading but all endeavours have been made to confirm the accuracy of the information. While I accept that most members will already know this information it sometimes pays to be reminded as it is all too simple to overlook some of these issues.

#### **Towing Mirrors:**

When you are towing your caravan or any other trailer that is wider than the narrowest part of the rear of your vehicle, it is a legal requirement that you fit additional towing mirrors. These mirrors must be E-Marked. As a very simple guide your mirrors are wide enough if you are able to see all the way along both sides of the caravan when towing.

If towing blind in the UK, (without towing mirrors), or using towing mirrors which are too narrow you can be prosecuted by the police, given 3 points on your licence and fined up to £1000 per offence (e.g. per side). Your insurance might also be invalidated if you are involved in an accident caused by not using wider mirrors.
