

## Rally: Moor Edge Farm

**Dates:** Friday 4th May to Monday 7th May

### Directions:

From the junction of the A38 with A61 turn towards Alfreton.

On exit of roundabout keep left and take left feed lane at traffic lights, straight over at mini roundabout & continue to T junction, Turn L at lights then in 20 metres turn R (be aware of low Railway bridge, narrow hump back bridge & narrow road through cliffs at South Wingfield)

Continue on road for approximately 2 miles up hill past Wingfield Manor, turn R onto Holme Lane /B5035, site on L in 300 metres just past Farm.

Look out for AAOCC signs

### Local information:

The Crich Memorial was erected in 1923 in memory of the 11,409 Sherwood Foresters who had died during the Great War 1914 - 1918 and the 1,520 Sherwood Foresters who had died during World War 2.

The National Tramway Museum contains over 60 (mainly British) trams built between 1900 and 1930 and is set within Crich Tramway Village, a period village containing a pub, cafe, old-style sweetshop and tram depots. The museum's collection of trams runs through the village setting with visitors transported one mile out into the local countryside and back. Also within reasonable distance you can find Chatsworth House and Wingfield Manor.
